Lemon Juice Writing

SKILL EXPLANATION:

Fluency is enhanced as children recognize words. Print awareness is developed as children recognize alphabet letters. Reading and writing are mutually beneficial activities.

ADULT PREPARATION:

- 1. Copy the family letter (Appendix B4).
- 2. Write I love you on a strip of paper.
- 3. Put lemon juice in small plastic cups.

ACTIVITY INTRODUCTION SUGGESTION:

"What do you use when you write? Today we are going to write a secret message with lemon juice."

THEME INTRODUCTION SUGGESTION:

This week's unit is *the five senses*. Today we will write a message that we won't be able to see until it dries."

PROCEDURES:

The children will complete the following steps:

- 1. Write their names on individual sheets of white construction paper with a pencil.
- 2. Dip a cotton swab into the lemon juice.
- 3. Look at the words on the strip of paper.
- 4. Identify the letters and the words.
- 5. Write *I love you* with the lemon juice and cotton swab.
- 6. Set the paper to the side to dry.
- 7. Once the paper is dry, take it home with the family note instructing the family to iron the paper.

NOTE:

The lemon juice will dry and become invisible. Heat from a low iron will turn the writing a light brown. The family will be able to then read the message.



AGES: 4-6

GROUP SIZE:

4-6 children

DEVELOPMENTAL GOALS:

- To develop print awareness
- ★ To enhance fine motor control

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

Using lemon juice and cotton swabs, the children will recognize words and write a message.
